REGULAR MEETING PROCEEDINGS SUMMARY:

The trustees of Scioto Township met in regular session, Wednesday, July 6, 2022 at 7:00 pm at the Township Hall, 3737 Ostrander Rd., Ostrander, OH 43061. Board members present were Ralph Moseley, Sandra Stults and Doug Loudenslager. Also present was Chief Marvin McIntire, Zoning Inspector Herb Ligocki, Maintenance Gary Beckley and Kathy Melvin. Others in attendance are included on the sign in sheet.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Trustee Stults moved to accept the minutes of the June 1 and June 15, 2022, as presented by the Fiscal Officer. The motion was seconded by Trustee Loudenslager. The roll call vote: Ms. Stults-yes, Mr. Moseley-yes, and Mr. Loudenslager-yes. The motion passed with 3-yes and 0-no votes.

PUBLIC COMMENT: NONE

Delaware County Engineer – Doug Riedel – Not Present

- Trustee Moseley provided an update on Taylor Road. The county could have this completed as early as tomorrow if weather permits.
- Slocum road is scheduled for grader patch on June 9.

FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT: See attached report

- Purchase Orders – Atlantic Emergency Solutions – Engine 371 – Pump Preventive Maintenance – Pump Seals, Valve Rebuilds and Air Primer Analysis, \$7,500.00. PO 07-06-2022-1
- Apparatus, Equipment or Station Repairs – Engine 371 – To Patriot Truck and Alignment for Radiator Cleaning after Pump Test. Annual Scott Air Pack Bench Testing – Completed annual testing on July 1st and had one minor repair on a unit. All units passed annual inspection. Breathing Air Compressor – Troubleshooting issues to the CO Monitor. If unable to resolve, service will be called for repair. Engine 372 – Will be scheduling at Patriot Truck and Alignment to have the AC checked.
- New Equipment – The SEEK Personal Thermal Imagers for each firefighter have arrived.
- 2022 Daytime Fire Coverage Update – Meeting was completed on June 14th with all our personnel to discuss the plan moving forward next year with Daytime Fire Coverage. No major concerns to report after the meeting was completed. Plan to present to the Board of Trustee's on the July 20th Mid-Monthly Board Meeting.
- Grant Updates – American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) First Responder Wellness, Recruitment, Retention & Resiliency Grant – Chief McIntire completed the Grant for the Recruitment, Resiliency and Retention of Firefighters and to support our funding for Daytime Fire Coverage. We did apply for two years of Payroll Funding assistance and funding for some Training. Grant was submitted and received at Ohio EMA on June 13th.

- Fire Levy History Information – Since 2000, we have had 6 – 2-Year Replacement Fire Levies and 1 – 5-Year Replacement Fire Levy. The 2017 Fire Levy was a Renewal. The average pass rate of the 7 – Replacement Fire Levies during this period of time is 63%. \$113.75 per 100,000.
- Follow up from alarm company and waiting on one part. Should come in the next week or so.
- Good to The Order:
- July 4th Fireworks Exhibition – Received support from Radnor Township Fire Department and Delaware County EMS medic 8. Pancake Breakfast – The Fire Association will host the Pancake Breakfast this year on Saturday morning July 16th from 7:00 to 10:30.

 - Nature Works needs a separate account for the grant money and distribution of funds from that account
 - Fences to separate the courts
 - Need to be 4ft high and will be \$4500 to add the additional fences
- Park Bench Install
 - Benches are being installed and looking good. They are going to be a great addition.

- Henry Property Demolition
 - State still working through applications and County has asked for our patience.
- Park Drainage
 - Meeting with SWCD 7/12 at 9am.
 - Looking over the drainage and provide considerations for existing ball diamond and new ball diamond
- Pond Treatment
 - Aqua Doc put new treatment on pond to help with algae and it is looking good

Trustee Moseley

- Status of Roadwork
 - Still a priority – however rain and funerals have hindered the progress.
- Tree down on Russell Road still needs addressed
- Houseman Road Speed Study
 - County would not do another speed study since they did one a year ago
 - Trustee Loudenslager contacted Sheriff's office for extra patrols of the road.
- Delco Water will be doing backflow test on Friday
- Trustees discussed tree trimmer when Township has fallen trees to help the maintenance department continue with their daily activities.
- Board of Elections contacted Trustee Moseley about dropping off equipment for the election August 2. Plan from BOE is to drop off July 30 from 8a to 12p and pick up August 6. BOE is aware they will be located in the foyer during this time.

Trustee Loudenslager made a motion to add fences to the pickleball courts to make continuation plan easier on all parties for a cost not to exceed \$4,500.00. The motion was seconded by Trustee Stults. Roll call vote: Mr. Loudenslager-yes, Mr. Moseley-yes, and Ms. Stults-yes. The motion passed with 3-yes and 0-no votes.
