Proposal: To create a model educational prairie at the Scioto Township Park **Primary Goal**: Provide a teaching site for area schools and the public in general to:

- Explore the role of native plants & pollinators for a healthy ecosystem.
- Learn the important role of bees in assisting agricultural production.
- Decrease mowing cost.
- Foster greater biodiversity to control tick & mosquito populations.
- Lay out a range of habitats, with signage to show distinct areas and create diversity of colorful blooms across three seasons (see attached diagram).

Funding: Reach out a range of sources, from National Lime & Stone, to private donors, and grants, along with creating a team of volunteers to do most of the work

 One route: Lay out an overall framework for the park as a whole, allowing us to seek funding from Partners for Fish & Wildlife, which looks for areas to maintain closer to 25 acres and more. Then work in stages over five or more years to create model areas (e.g. removal of the brushy tree area south; cultivate a range of native trees to establish transitions zones).

Implementation: Work with partners in NCOPP's proposed Project Kaleidoscope initiative to prepare, plant, and maintain the educational prairie, modeled on Licking County's program called Meadow for Monarchs. We are in conversation with these partners who have expressed interest in being involved with this project:

- Chris Roshon and Lauren Richards at Preservation Parks
- Jeff Dickinson, farmer & educator at Stratford Ecological Center
- Cody Grasser, the state coordinator for Pheasants Forever
- Scott Stephens, head of Delaware Soil & Water
- Erin Fisher, Communications & Education Specialist at Delaware S&W
- Ryan Morr at Partners for Fish & Wildlife
- Brent Sodergren, head of Partners for Fish & Wildlife (who has said that they would "see what we can do" if we get something going here)



Project Areas


A – This area is currently turf. We would create a 2.6 acre mixed demonstration area representing several different styles of prairie and wildflower gardens. These gardens would be used to teach the public as well as professionals. There would be grass pathways through the entire 2.6 acres. This area would be extremely pleasing aesthetically. The growth would mature in 3-5 years.

B/C – These two 1.25 acre areas are currently experiencing the early stages of secondary succession. The area is divided into two smaller plots because each is at different stages in succession. We could use these areas to teach what secondary succession is and how to manage a site during this stage of growth.

D – This 0.5 acre area is currently turf. It would make another great site for a prairie/wildflower planting as well as a demonstration/teaching site for natural playground design and installation.

E – This 0.5 acre woodland pond is a wonderful natural feature. Access could be improved as well as management. This feature could be used to educate the public and professionals on managing natural bodies of water.

These project areas cover 4.85 acres. The other 14.05 acres of forest and pathways are in need of invasive plant management as well as an overall management program. This 18.9 acre site, overall, is very special. It is not very often that a site is able to provide so many different opportunities for education in such close proximity. On this site there are opportunities to educate others on management of prairies, secondary succession, forest regulation, and ponds. There is also a great opportunity for plant identification and cataloging as well as restoration and proper invasive removal strategies.
